Thanks to generous support from donors like you, Nazareth Hospital's new Stroke Department is open and running. Stroke is the third most common cause of death in Israel and timely diagnosis is critical.

In the past, stroke patients were sent to other hospitals, and precious time was lost before diagnosis and treatment could happen. Now these services are available at Nazareth Hospital, saving lives and preventing lasting damage and disability.

Donors in Nazareth, Europe and the US contributed a spectacular \$400,000 toward the campaign! The business community in Nazareth committed more than half of the total with one million shekels (\$284,000) commitment to the project.

Every two seconds someone in the world has a stroke and they are the third-highest cause of death in Israel. A huge thank you to all who supported the creation of Nazareth's first Stroke Department and helped provide the life-saving care for the people of Nazareth.

Dr. Saleem Khoury, one of Israel's leading neurologists, has joined Nazareth Hospital to lead the new unit. Currently, the unit is operating primarily as an out-patient service. Construction continues to create additional space for the new department.

On June 6th, Israel's Deputy Minister of Health, MK Rabbi Yaakov Litzman, visited Nazareth Hospital and toured various departments including the Stroke Department. Following the visit, the Ministry of Health granted our hospital the license needed to operate a second CT scanner. This addition will equip Nazareth's Stroke Department as an emergency service by 2020.

Deputy Minister Litzman also recognized Nazareth Hospital's continued achievements in multiple fields.

Nazareth Hospital needs other new and expanded facilities in the years ahead, including upgraded dialysis services. Diabetes is a growing problem in northern Israel and the Hospital will expand dialysis services while strengthening its public education campaign including diabetes prevention.

### "Healing and Hope" Tour during March 13-22





The tour will be hosted by Kim Haines Eitzen, an NPI board member and a professor at Cornell University. Kim lived in Nazareth as a child during the years her father served as chaplain of Nazareth Hospital. Kim is Professor of Religion in Late Antiquity at Cornell. Kim's hopes for the trip include:

#### "Cycle the 3 Seas" bike ride: 195 miles during March 22-28



The five-day bike ride offers the opportunity to experience the Holy Land in a unique way. Starting in Tel Aviv, riders climb the foothills of Jerusalem and explore the Old City, descend from Bethlehem to the Dead Sea and finish by cycling through the Galilee region and climbing through the forests to Nazareth. 2019 cyclist Herb Buckwalter (left, seen chatting with villagers) said: "Cycling is a unique way to experience Israel/Palestine; it brings you closer to the land. Participating in the Nazareth Challenge offers opportunities to interact with people along the way and to get to know other cyclists. The Challenge is well planned, led, and supported along the route."

## Hike the "Jesus Trail" from Nazareth to Capernaum during March 22-28



Hikers of the Jesus Trail will spend five days walking the 40 miles from Nazareth to Capernaum. Highlights of this carefully-created route include the archaeological ruins of Zippori village, sweeping Galilee views of the Horns of Hattin, Nebu Shu'eib (the holiest shrine of the Druze religion) and the stunning vistas of the Galilean countryside in full bloom. Each day provides a completely different experience for the hikers. Accommodation includes staying in B&Bs run by Arab families, hotels located in Jewish Kibbutzes and guest houses on the Sea of Galilee's shore.
