A Visit to Nazareth Village Leads to a Major Gift

Terrance (Terry) Overholser has volunteered to serve on the International Chaplaincy team at Nazareth Hospital—a natural extension of his personal Christian faith and counseling experience. Terry has also been a faithful supporter of Nazareth Village since his first visit in 2019.

In the 1980s, Terry, his wife Dawn, and their two daughters lived in Asia and Europe while he worked in international banking. In 1988 he was transferred to New York City to take over responsibility for the bank's international operating subsidiary.

Within a few years, facing a mid-life crisis, Terry sensed a call to become equipped as a counselor. Building on his multi-cultural business and people skills, he pursued full-time graduate work at Columbia University in psychology, so

he could better help those struggling with either marital issues at home or leadership challenges at work.

He put this work on hold in 2018 when his wife began to suffer from a variety of health problems that limited her freedom. When her late-stage cancer was discovered, she had only a few weeks to live.

After Dawn's death, stunned and in deep

mourning, Terry made a trip to Israel with his grandson Cameron. The trip

included a visit to Nazareth Village where Terry had new personal and spiritual insights.

Terry received a strong sense that God had something very special in mind for him in Israel— and Nazareth in particular.

Terry and Cameron were both impressed with the Village's historical authenticity and sincere representation of the life and teachings of Jesus of Nazareth. Before leaving the Village, they placed a stone in honor of Dawn.

After reading Dr. Robert Martin's memoir, *Together in Galilee*, Terry and Bob met in person. The two friends have since traveled between their respective homes in Annapolis, MD and Wrightsville, PA to share food, coffee, and conversation.

Bob notes that Terry's experiences mirror some of his own. "When I first met Terry last September I was impressed by his deep sense of calling to serve the Lord by reaching out to the people of Israel and particularly in Nazareth. Because of similar life experiences—including the death of a spouse—we quickly developed a mutual friendship."

Terry highlights that he and Bob share a common commitment to faith and service. "It is so rare to meet someone with Bob's intelligence and training willing to give so freely of himself for a higher cause. He has that rare quality of both strength of conviction and humility, both head and heart.

"I wish I had known his wife, Nancy, for what they did has created a lasting legacy of faith and service that will live in eternity."

The menu included savory roasted chicken, lentil soup, cabbage salad, authentic dips and pita bread, along with a dessert of apple slices with date paste. Visitors always remarked how delicious the food was, and how special the experience!

Volunteering in the Chaplaincy program at Nazareth Hospital is also a treasured memory. What a special opportunity to show and share the love of Jesus! I was paired with a local volunteer and we would visit different wards, visiting and praying with anyone who welcomed this form of encouragement. I became friends with one such patient, and we now keep in touch through Facebook.

During my time in Nazareth, I clearly felt God confirming His call on my life. Lord willing, I hope to return when the borders open, and volunteer long term with SERVE Nazareth. All those with a heart to serve, and a love of adventure should consider applying. Housing and food are provided for a very reasonable monthly fee, and opportunities to explore the many spots of historical significance are made available. Believe me when I say, you will be blessed! SERVE Nazareth plans to re-open later in spring 2022.
