**Nazareth Hospital Provides Advanced Training for Palestinian Physicians:** 

The Result is *Improved* Access to Healthcare in the West Bank

or people in the West Bank and Gaza, accessing healthcare services can be extremely frustrating and difficult. Palestinian healthcare professionals are educated, caring, and highly dedicated, but their work is often hindered by movement restrictions and infrastructure shortages within the Palestinian Territories.

Obstacles to medical care such as lack of reliable electricity, equipment and supplies are compounded by the simple fact that there are not enough specialists, particularly in fields of medicine where advanced training is very limited.

This year, Nazareth Hospital is providing advanced training opportunities to four West Bank doctors. The training which is similar to a medical residency, will include specialization in several areas: Internal Medicine, Emergency Medicine,

Palestinian doctors sometimes travel to Europe or the US for their advanced training and do not always return to Palestine once they complete their program. If they train in Nazareth it is very likely that they will return to the West Bank to practice medicine.

This is why 29-year-old Jenin resident, Dr. Fidaa Amour, completed training as a Diagnostic Radiologist at Nazareth Hospital. Dr. Amour earned her medical degree at An-Najah National University in Nablus, West Bank. After graduation, Dr. Amour began exploring options for specialization, and chose Diagnostic Radiology based both on her personal interest and the great need of her community in Jenin.

Dr. Amour was one of only a few hundred Palestinian doctors permitted to cross into Israel from the West Bank when she began her advanced training at the Nazareth Hospital. During the four-year program, Dr. Amour learned all the necessary and required modalities of her specialty, including ultrasound techniques, CT, and MRI.

After completing her advanced training requirements in December of 2022. Dr. Amour successfully passed the Palestinian Authority's Board Certification in Diagnostic Radiology.

Citing the lack of female physicians in the Palestinian territories who specialize in breast imaging for diagnosis, Dr. Amour writes, "I hope to provide this service to my community even at a

small level. I am grateful for this opportunity that the Nazareth Hospital provided me. I hope that I will be able to fill in the gap for much-needed services and expertise in my community in the Palestinian Territories."

Dr. Tareq Shabana studied medicine at the University of Cairo (Qasr El Einy), Egypt. He returned home to Hebron District to work mainly in Internal Medicine and Cardiology. When he heard about Nazareth Hospital's opportunities for Palestinian doctors to train and specialize in different fields of medicine, he applied.

"I was fortunate to connect with the Nazareth Hospital and be accepted in Emergency Medicine. The main goal is to train and return to Hebron, my hometown, in order to help the Palestinian people and provide the best care I can in my area of specialization. I am very grateful for this opportunity that the Nazareth Hospital is providing me."

Currently, four West Bank physicians are beginning their Advanced Training at Nazareth Hospital. They plan to return with advanced skills in the areas of Internal Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Laparoscopic & Bariatric Surgery, Obstetrics & Gynecology and Radiology & Orthopedics.

specialized care will not have to travel across multiple military checkpoints or face unacceptable, life-threatening delays to access care.

Palestinian doctors trained at Nazareth Hospital in the past were funded from a West Bank organization. However, that funding is no longer available. As a result NPI is raising funding for the training costs.

NPI plans to raise partial support for each of these four doctors—a total of \$70,000 during 2023 and 2024. To date, \$15,000 has been raised in lead gifts. Your contribution will help us to match those lead gifts and reach our goal.

#### Brubakers boost Nancy Martin Fund

In December 2022, Harold and Virginia Brubaker made a special \$12,000 contribution to the Nancy Martin Memorial Scholarship Fund. The gift was "special" since Nancy was married to Virginia's brother, Dr. Bob Martin. It was also special because it gave a significant boost to NPI's fundraising efforts to reach \$200,000 in the scholarship fund before the end of 2023.

The Brubaker's owned and operated a dairy farm near Mt. Joy, PA for 41 years and retired from farming in 1996. Last year they moved to a retirement community in Ephrata, PA.

Though busy with raising a family and farming, Virginia and Harold were always interested in Bob and Nancy Martin's work in Nazareth. In 1977 they visit the Martins in Israel along with daughters Christine and Sharon. Fortyone years later, in 2018, their daughter, Twila, joined an NPI tour to Israel that was hosted by Nancy and Bob. Twila describes the tour as a highlight of her life. During 2019 and 2020 Twila served on the NPI Board.

During three assignments totaling eighteen years the Martins served Nazareth Hospital and Nazareth School of Nursing. Nancy served as director of nursing education at the School from 1987 to 1995 and oversaw the development of its RN diploma program which was accredited by Israel's Ministry of Health.

The Nancy Martin Memorial Scholarship Fund is an endowment fund held by Nazareth Project and managed by Everence Financial Services. The goal is to begin annual distributions to the School after the fund surpasses \$200,000. Currently, \$180,000 has been raised including the special gift from the Brubakers.
