



Dr. Tareq Shabana, a physician from the West Bank, is currently in his first year of specialized training in emergency medicine at the Nazareth Hospital. Most emergency medicine departments in West Bank hospitals lack expertise in case management and operate mainly on triage.

Dr. Shebana's main goal is to train and return to Hebron, his hometown, in order to help the Palestinian people. "I want to provide the best care I can in my area of specialization. I am very grateful for this opportunity that the Nazareth Hospital is providing me." Dr. Shaban plans to work at Al Ghad Hospital in Hebron.
